



## Course Overview

The **Fire Team Operations** course offered by Mines Rescue provides participants with the required skills and knowledge to perform the role of a Fire Team Member at open cut or underground mines. The course covers all legislative requirements for MDG 1032 and Clause 45 of the CMHS Regulation. The delivery of the course is flexible and can be delivered over three consecutive days but is generally divided up over the year to maintain skills.

Participants who complete this course are provided the opportunity to attend an additional days training to attain the qualification of Fire Officer.

Upon successful completion of the Fire Team Operations course participants will gain skills and knowledge in:

- Planning and preparing for fire operations
- Operation roles within the scope of the team
- Fighting and containing fires
- Finalising the fire operation

### Who should attend?

This course would benefit all persons involved in open cut or underground mining but is particularly aimed at individuals wishing to increase or enhance their fire fighting skills as part of coordinated team response fire related emergencies.



### Duration

Training time is equivalent to 24 hours and the delivery format is flexible (e.g. six four hour training sessions delivered over a 12 month period).

### Delivery method

A combination of face-to-face classroom based training, desktop scenarios and practical training exercises.



### Assessment method

Assessment may include written and oral questioning, practical demonstrations and performing scenarios.

### Entry requirements

It is also an expectation that participants have experience working in an open cut or underground mine environment.

It is acknowledged that this course requires a moderate level of language, literacy and numeracy skills to manage course work, in-course activities and assessment tasks.
