





Exposed to risk workers and claims frequency rate



Claims rate




Location of injury (all claims received 2017-18)







Monitoring workers' health (chest x-rays)




Drug and alcohol screening (results for 2017-18)


Order 42 - Airborne dust rate of occupational exposure limit exceedances




Occupational exposure monitoring




Average Respirable Dust Exposure (mg/m³)







Attendance at the Generic Underground Induction for coal mines






