## Presentation: Serious Mining Incidents – Legal & Investigation Considerations

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### **Overview of Presentation:**

- The NSW Mining industry transitioned from prescriptive legislation to less prescriptive general duty of care legislation in the late 1990's. This was accompanied by a significant reduction in the number of fatal incidents
- The primary standards of care found in the legislation are section 19 (PCBU) Primary Duty of Care – Section 27 Duty of Officers (Due Diligence) and Section 28 Duties of Workers (Reasonable Care)
- Duty holders should also take strong action to avoid reckless conduct
- Duty holders have responsibilities in relation to reasonably foreseeable risk
- Human failure is causal in many serious incidents but does not occur in isolation and must be considered by workers and management when assessing & controlling risks.
- Incident prevention relies on the practical use of multiple controls
