



## Mines Rescue selected as finalist at NSW Training Awards

Training is conducted in purpose-built facilities with real equipment to simulate authentic scenarios, including fighting actual fires and using genuine breathing apparatus.

Being selected as a finalist for the Large Training Provider of the Year award highlights the organisation's outstanding commitment to delivering high-quality training programs, innovative teaching methods, and exceptional outcomes for learners.

'We recently won the Hunter Safety Awards 'Best WHS Training Program' and now to be selected as a finalist at the NSW Training Awards is a real honour. It recognises the passion and dedication of Mines Rescue's trainers and RTO team and the impact they have on advancing industry standards and enhancing workplace skills,' Lachlan said.
