

This course provides a practical understanding of occupational hygiene for people who need to manage or advise on workplace health issues.

Target audience

This course is targeted to health professionals and occupational health specialists working in the mining industry.

The examples and activities used during the course are primarily based on coal mining activities.

Learning outcomes

On successful completion of this course, participants will have a basic understanding of:

- the value of occupational hygiene and the role of the occupational hygienist
- the range of hazards (physical and chemical) in the workplace
- hazard recognition techniques
- sources and potential routes of exposure
- hazard evaluation, exposure assessment and measurement processes
- methods of controlling exposure
- the management of occupational hygiene programmes.

Course format

The course will be run over five (5) days and includes demonstrations and practical activities, overnight questions and guided reading. Participants will be provided with a study manual and course notes.

At the end of the course there will be an openbook examination comprised of 40 multiple choice questions. Time allowed will be 90 minutes. This will be an online assessment and you will need to use your own laptop.

On successful completion of the course and examination, the participant will receive a Certificate of Completion in the OHTA201 Basic Principles in Occupational Hygiene (ohtatraining.org).
